

Bartow County Quick Facts:

- Bartow County is 470 square miles with 77,416 acres on 469 family owned farms. Woodland forests and farms cover 25% of the total land area in Bartow.
- The 2021 Bartow County Population was estimated at 110,843 people.
- Bartow has the 24th largest population out of 159 counties in Georgia.
- The total Food & Fiber sector in Bartow employs over 2,167 people with an economic output of \$273 million dollars.


A Salute To Georgia's #1 Commodity: Poultry



The poultry-egg industry adds \$21.5 billion dollars to the Georgia economy each year and contributes over 82,000 jobs. Georgia has led the nation in broiler production for several decades.

Three out of every four counties in Georgia are involved in poultry and egg production. On an average day, Georgia produces 30.4 million pounds of chicken, 7.6 million table eggs and 5.6 million hatching eggs!

Modern breeds of broiler (meat) chickens can grow 4 to 7 pounds in 6 weeks!



Economic Impact of the Agriculture Industry in Bartow County

Agriculture: The Foundation

Bartow County has a strong and diverse agricultural sector which co-exists with a rapidly growing suburban population within its county borders. The 77,416 acres of farmland in Bartow produces a multitude of agricultural products. Bartow County ranks in the top 44 out of 159 counties in Georgia for Total Farm Gate Value.

Poultry is the number one agricultural enterprise in Bartow County. On-farm production is approximately \$54 million dollars. There are currently 172 commercial poultry houses in Bartow County.

Livestock - Beef cattle are a significant part to the agricultural economy with over 20,000 animals on Bartow County farms. Bartow ranks in the top 10 counties in Georgia for livestock production. Goats are a rising commodity in Bartow County along with other livestock such as sheep, swine, alpacas, and honeybees. Livestock production accounts for over \$10 million dollars of on farm sales per year.

Equine - Bartow County has a growing recreational horse population. We now have an estimated 1,000 horses valued at over \$3.2 million dollars. There are currently 20 licensed boarding stables in Bartow.

Horticulture is a solid component in Bartow's agricultural production. We have several ornamental nurseries and greenhouses in Bartow with 22 acres of field and container grown plants. Bartow also has over 1,350 acres in commercial turfgrass production. Ornamental plants, turfgrass, and vegetable transplants accounts for over \$15 million dollars in on farm sales. Landscaping businesses generate approximately \$10 million dollars in added value services to parks, recreation, golf, and green industries in Bartow County.

Row and Forage Crops - Bartow is home to one of the last remaining cotton gins in North Georgia. Over 5,000 acres of row crops such as corn, cotton, and soybeans account for \$5 million dollars in annual production value. Forage crops such as wheat, hay, millet, and alfalfa add another \$4 million dollars in annual production value on over 10,500 acres.


