

Master Gardener Program Brian Bradford , Elbert County ANR Agent

Many extension offices in our state have a Master Gardener Program that they implement in their counties. Some of you may or may not know what the Master Gardener Program is about, so here are a few details. Master gardeners do various things and participate in multiple ways in their counties. Master Gardeners are *volunteer educators*. Typical volunteer activities include answering plant questions over the phone, in person, or by e-mail; conducting environmental gardening demonstrations or presentations; staffing plant clinics; maintaining compost and gardening demonstration sites; writing newsletters or newspapers; youth gardening activities; and other community gardening projects. As you can see, master gardeners don't just do one thing or another; they are involved in many different ways with the extension office and the community. This leads us to the next question if interested how does someone become a master gardener.

Georgia residents may have the opportunity to become a Georgia Master Gardener Extension Volunteer in their home county. Classes usually form either in the spring or fall. Interested volunteer candidates should contact their local county Cooperative Extension office to see if an active program exists and when the next class will be taught. Upon acceptance into the program, volunteers will be required to complete a 42-hour (usually once or twice a week) classroom training program covering topics ranging from landscape design, plant propagation, and turf to different programs such as nuisance wildlife control. Again, the program intends to train volunteers in subjects that will prepare them to assist the local county Extension Staff. Participants take a mid-term exam and will be required to pass a final exam on the material covered. Master Gardeners are recruited and trained to assist Extension with extending consumer horticulture information and education to the public.

The Georgia Master Gardener Program continues to grow across the state. Over 3,000 active Master Gardeners volunteer their time across the state each year, contributing more than one hundred seventy-thousand hours of volunteer service. This translates to almost 4 million dollars in service donated annually by volunteers. Helping our county agents with phone calls continues to be a widespread use of volunteer time, but Master Gardeners also serve in many other capacities. Some Master Gardeners make home garden visits in place of the county agent, saving the agent's time to work on other matters. In addition, they plant and maintain school and community gardens, conduct classes, and lead many other educational activities.

As a result of educational activities offered by Master Gardeners, Georgians can make environmentally sound gardening decisions. Because Master Gardeners work with Georgians to answer questions and solve problems, insects and diseases can be treated with appropriate controls, plant choices can be made to enhance landscapes and property values, individuals can grow their fruits and vegetables, and youth gain exposure to the joy and wonder of gardening. As a result of master gardeners' efforts, agents can devote time to developing targeted educational programs that address local issues and needs. MGEVs ultimately help Extension achieve its mission of assisting Georgians to become healthier, more productive, financially independent, and environmentally responsible.

What Georgia Commodity is Celebrated on April 14? Christa Campbell, Elbert County FACS Agent

Do you know what is celebrated on April 14 each year? Let me give you a hint...it is one of Georgia's commodities. Still stumped...it grows on trees in a shell! You may have guessed by now that April 14 is National Pecan Day! It was first celebrated in 1996, when the National Pecan Shellers Association establishes National Pecan Day to honor the native nut of America. Pecans are the only tree nut native to the United States. Pecans are part of the Hickory family.

Did you know, America is credited for 75%-80% of the world's total pecan production? There are fourteen states that grow pecans. However, Georgia is the nation's top producer of pecans, producing an estimated 100 million pounds of pecans annually. Pecans add between \$200 million and \$300 million each year to the state's gross domestic product. The Georgia Pecan Commission was founded in 1995 by Georgia pecan growers. The commission was established to raise awareness of the nutritional, health and economic benefits of pecans as a regular part of the American diet, in order to increase sales and trade opportunities for pecan growers in Georgia. Pecans are an excellent source of copper, iron, magnesium, manganese, phosphorus, zinc, and vitamin E. Pecans are also recognized by the American Heart Association as heart-healthy because they can help reduce LDL cholesterol and increase HDL cholesterol levels in the blood. They are also rich in dietary fiber. One ounce of pecans provides 10 percent of the Recommended Daily Value (RDV) for fiber.
