Winter is Presentation time with Project Achievement DPA Your opportunity to communicate what you are passionate about!



District Project Achievement (DPA) is an annual poster presentation contest featured as one of Georgia 4-H's core programs. Gwinnett 4-H holds participation in this contest as one of the key areas we offer in youth development.

It involves giving a presentation in front of a supportive audience about something you enjoy. For example, you may wish to talk about your friends, hobbies, or careers. This is your chance to share your dream and communicate to others what excites you, in just six minutes, for Grades 4 through 6 called cloverleaf, Grades 7 and 8 have 10 minutes, called Juniors. Grades 9-12 have 12 minutes and are called Seniors.

Everyone is passionate about something! If you have never spoken in front of a group, don't worry, it's not impossible. We can cut the project down to manageable bites and with some coaching you will harness the adrenaline rush that public speaking provides. This life skill is well worth the effort and you will be impressed by your results.

Presentations may be made in any one of the 56 project areas with more details and the digital path to the 4-H State information on DPA below. As grade levels increase project areas are combined, your specialty is not lost.

We can do this together and now is the best time to begin. What you need to know is this is a life skill training your child will use and appreciate having learned in the future when they share ideas, give presentations, write resumes, interview and enter the work force.

Project Achievement Time line:

- Pick a topic and get 4-H staff approved
- 7th-12th grades turn in a 1 year resume, "portfolio" in 4-H code, early January
- 4th-6th show 4-H staff their demonstration in January
- 4th-6th compete in February, one day event, on a Saturday, event location varies for Area Competition
- 7th-12th show 4-H staff demonstration by February
- 7th-12th compete, three days 2 nights weekend event at Rock Eagle in early March
- 9th -12th graders placing first in their project area go on to State competition, 4 weekdays in July, in Atlanta
