## Hydrangeas

**Limelight hydrangea** - Limelight' has unique bright chartreuse blooms in mid-summer right into autumn when the blooms change color to a rich deep pink - breathtaking! This is an **easy to grow** plant with **reliable flowering** and color regardless of soil pH. The **flower heads are up to 12" and held upright**. Good in groupings and masses, in perennial and shrub borders, and in containers, Great cut flower.

**Harlequin Hydrangea** - **pinkish-red and white variegated flowers**. Vigorous growth and sturdy stems. Provide well-drained, rich soil with mulch. Best in morning sun with afternoon filtered sun.

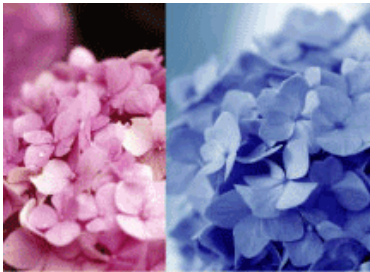

**Dooley Hydrangea** – the blooms can be blue or pink depending on the acidity of the soil. Ideally, prune after flowering. Provide well-drained acidic, moisture-retentive soil and organic mulch. Plant in partial shade. Grows 3-5' x 3-5' wide.

**2 gal. \$6.00**



**Penny Mac** - Repeatedly produces abundant flowers on new growth. Flowers are colored pink(alkaline soil) or blue (acid soil), and make beautiful dried flowers. Best placed in borders & groupings. Provide well-drained, rich soil with mulch. Plant in partial shade. Grows 3-5' x 3-5' wide.

## AZALEAS

**My Mary** - Large pure yellow flowers in mid-April, and delight the senses with their **fragrance**. Plant in rich, well-drained soil with morning sun.

**Camillia's Blush** - Soft pink blooms held in large trusses with a delightful fragrance. A hardy plant blooming early. Plant in rich, well-drained soil with morning sun.

**'Gibraltar' Knapp Hill Hybrid** - Deciduous azalea. Flame orange flowers with ruffled petals. By far the most heat tolerant and vigorous of the Knapp Hill group. Often listed as Exbury. Height 6 to 8'. Blooms Mid-April.

## RABBITEYE VARIETIES

Native to the south, rabbiteyes start ripening in June and can extend the picking season into August. At least two varieties are needed for cross pollination.
