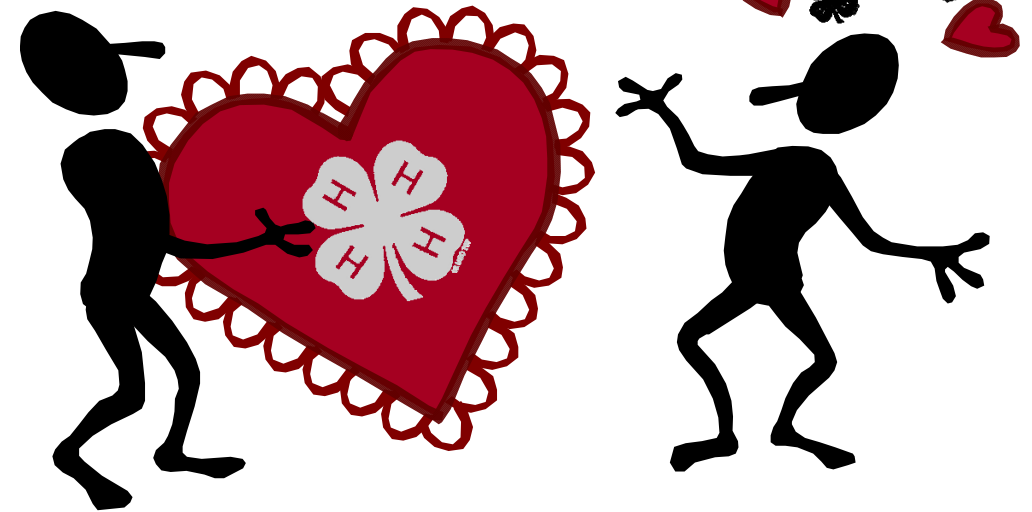

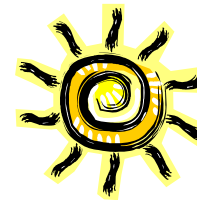

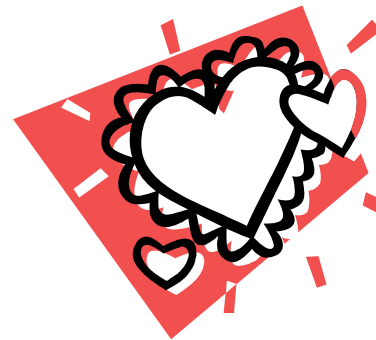


February School Service
