Suggestions for CPA

1. Choose **1 (one)** project.
2. Prepare a **3-6 minute** speech for CPA. 6 minutes is the maximum time allowed.
EXCEPTION: Performing Arts time limit is 4 minutes
A piano will be at the school for Performing Arts – Instrumental.
3. You may use posters. Keep them flat in order to make letters easy to read.
4. You may use notes. Index cards look more professional than notebook paper.
5. No visual aids or posters in Public Speaking category.
6. No live animals or weapons may be used in any presentation.

Special Project Instructions

No items may be used in presentations which are not allowed by school code of conduct.

Examples, matches, lighters, weapons, etc.

Creative Stitchery – 4-H'ers will prepare a garment or item that includes a seam, finish, and fastener in the one item. Items may include, but are not limited to, a pillow, purse, duffle bag, apron, shorts, skirt, or any other item. 4-H'ers will be asked questions relative to selecting and sewing their item or garment.

Between Meal Snacks – 4-H'er will plan and bring a partial daily menu including a dinner meal and a snack and prepare the no-cook snack from the plan. The no cook snack must be prepared in the one hour time allotted including setting up, preparation of the dish, display and clean up. Ingredients for recipe prepared must be measured on site during competition. Ingredients that will be peeled, chopped or cut, however, must be prepared at home and brought to the contest ready for use as knives are not allowed at cloverleaf competition. 4-H'ers should display the snack. 4-H'ers will provide all food and equipment needed; be dressed appropriately with closed toe shoes and hair net. 4-H'ers will be scored on management and food preparation techniques; serving prepared snack appropriately; knowledge of foods, nutrition and meal planning exhibited in discussion with judges.

For CPA the snack may be made ahead of time at home and presented with table setting for the judges and answer questions. If you advance to DPA with this project – you will actually take your ingredients to Rock Eagle and prepare the snack as a Food Lab as described above.

Food Fare – 4-H'er will plan and bring a one day menu, which includes snacks, and prepare a no-cook snack in the allotted time. Ingredients for recipe prepared must be measured on site during the lab competition. The no cook snack must be prepared in the one hour time allotted including setting up, preparation of the dish, display and clean up. Ingredients for recipe prepared must be measured on site during competition. Ingredients that will be peeled, chopped or cut, however, must be prepared at home and brought to the contest ready for use as knives are not allowed at cloverleaf competition. 4-H'ers should display the snack. 4-H'ers will provide all food and equipment needed; be dressed appropriately with closed toe shoes and hair net. Time includes setup, preparation, display and cleanup. 4-H'ers will be scored on management and food preparation techniques; serving prepared snack appropriately; knowledge of foods, nutrition and meal planning exhibited in discussion with judges.
