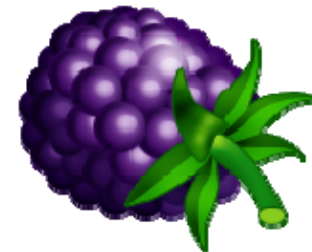
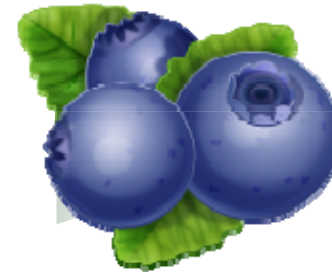

Available Plants

All plants are in 1 gallon pots

Figs	
Celeste —Fruit are small to medium in size, light brown to violet-brown skin, whitish-pink colored flesh, a closed eye, and very few seed. Plants produce in early summer and are self-pollinating.	\$9.00
Kadota —Fruit are medium in size, yellowish-white skin, white to amber flesh, and a very good flavor. Plants are very vigorous and prolific, bearing twice in most years. Plants are also very hardy and adaptive in the South.	\$9.00
LSU Purple —Fruit are medium in size, purple skin color, reddish pulp, and a good flavor. Plants are very prolific bearing sooner than most figs and often bearing twice a year.	\$9.00
Muscadines	
Carlos —Bronze; Fruit are small to medium in size, ripen early to mid season, produce in clusters, ripens very evenly and is a very heavy producer.	\$9.00
Nesbit —Black ; fruit are very large in size, cluster, high yields, and ripen mid to late season. Plants are very vigorous, disease resistant, and cold-hardy. Self fertile.	\$9.00
Noble —Black; fruit are small in size, very large clusters, very high yields, and ripen mid season. Plants are moderately vigorous with good disease resistance except to powdery mildew. Self fertile.	\$9.00
Summit —Reddish Bronze; fruit are medium to large in size, excellent flavor, high yields, and ripen early to mid season. Plants are very vigorous and have very good disease resistance. Female plant, needs a self-fertile companion.	\$9.00
Raspberry	
Nova — Fruit are medium in size, dark red, and ripen early. Plants have average growth height and are fairly disease resistant.	\$9.00
Heritage —Fruit are large in size, dark red, and very sweet. Plants have upright vigorous growth habits and adapt well in most well-drained soils.	\$9.00

Blueberries	
<i>Early Season Varieties</i>	
Brightwell —Fruit ripens in early to mid June through mid July. Plants have very vigorous and upright growing characteristics. Brightwell is one of the most reliable varieties for fruiting. Berries have a medium size and excellent flavor.	\$9.00
Climax —Early fruiting variety maturing in the middle of June. Plants have upright growth habits with more of an open spreading crown than other varieties. Climax has been used for years in commercial, pick-your-own, and home settings. Berries are firm with excellent flavor and good color.	\$9.00
Premier —Ripen early to mid season but usually earlier than other mid-season varieties. Fruit are larger in size with excellent color and great flavor. Plant growth habit is upright and vigorous.	\$9.00
<i>Mid to Late Season Varieties</i>	
Powderblue —Ripens mid season. Berries are very light blue in color, medium in size with good firmness and flavor. Plants have an upright, spreading growth habit and are an excellent choice for using in ornamental settings.	\$9.00
Chaucer —Fruit ripens early and has low chill hour requirement. Plants have vigorous spreading growth habit. Fruit is medium in size.	\$9.00
Tifblue —Ripens mid to late season. Fruit are medium size with good flavor. Plants have a good upright growth habit. Tifblue is one of the oldest cultivars that is still being planted.	\$9.00
Blackberries	
Apache —Fruit are very large in size, with very good flavor, and high yields. Thornless.	\$9.00
Arapaho —Fruit are medium in size, good flavor, and good yields. Thornless.	\$9.00
Navaho —Fruit are medium in size, excellent flavor, and good yields. Thornless.	\$9.00
