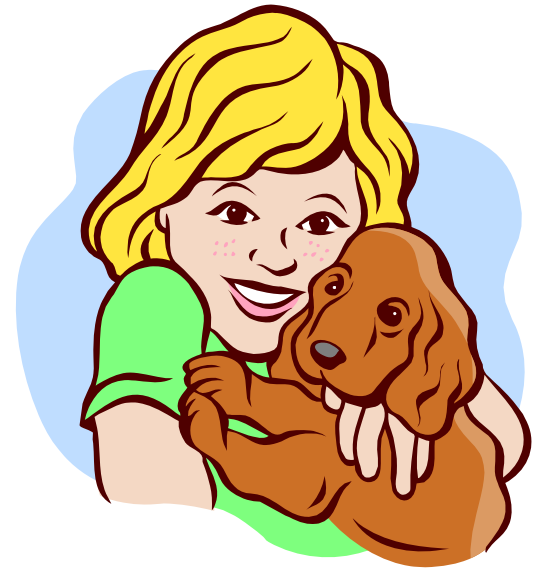


The Coweta County Dog Club

The Coweta County 4-H Dog Club is an organization dedicated to the promotion of dogs and responsible dog ownership. Children do not have to own a dog to join the 4-H Dog Club. All that is required is a love of dogs and a desire to learn more about them. Topics to be covered include familiarization with the numerous breeds, grooming, general care, proper raising & training of puppies, veterinary care, careers involving dogs, obedience training and show training. 4-H participants may also develop projects involving some aspect of dogs. Those wishing to eventually compete in Junior Showmanship competition at AKC shows will be instructed how to accomplish that.



The 4-H Dog Club meets the **3rd Tuesday** of every month at 7pm at the Coweta County Fairgrounds on Pine Road, Newnan, in the horse arena meeting room (please review the 4-H newsletter calendar for possible location changes).
