Area Cloverleaf Project Achievement

Area Cloverleaf Project Achievement for the DeKalb County Delegation will be held Saturday, February 12, 2011 at the Rock Eagle 4-H Center in Eatonton, Georgia.

The three highest scores in each project category will represent the DeKalb County 4-H program at Area Cloverleaf Project Achievement. Delegates will be notified in writing by mail as well as through their club leader by January 22, 2011.

Delegates will have until January 28, 2011 to notify the County 4-H office as to whether the 4-H'er can attend competition.

We will depart at 6:30 AM on Saturday morning, February 12, 2011 and return by 4:00 PM. The cost for all delegates is free.

Most Cloverleaf Project Presentations are ILLUSTRATED TALKS (presentations using posters or other props). Talks last six (6) minutes and showing the steps of the preparation is not required.

EXCEPTIONS TO ILLUSTRATED TALKS ARE: Food Fare & Between Meal Snacks. A specified product must be prepared from start to finish during a scheduled lab period. No formal presentation is required, however 4-H'er must be able to answer questions about foods and nutrition.



What is Project Achievement?

The purpose of project achievement is to provide an out-of-county educational experience and to give recognition for outstanding accomplishments in 4-H work. 4-H'ers who have been selected as county winners in the various 4-H activities and projects available to Cloverleaf 4-H members will compete with other county winners in their district for district honors.

Eligibility Rules:

- Must be a 4-H member and in good standing.
- Must be at least 9 years old on January 1 of the current 4-H year. Must not have completed 6th grade on January 1st of the current 4-H year.
- No previous first place cloverleaf project achievement district winner is eligible to participate again as a Cloverleaf in the same project area.



Objectives:

- To acquire an understanding of subject matter in a given project area.
- To develop skills in researching, and presenting information.
- To stimulate interest in continuing project work through 4-H experiences.
- To provide opportunities for 4-H members to develop and enhance qualities of integrity, sportsmanship, cooperation, poise and self-confidence.
- To help 4-H members develop skills in leadership and community.

General Competition Information

- Counties may bring up to three (3) 4-H'ers regardless of gender.
- Cloverleaf presentations should be limited to a maximum of six (6) minutes. Exception: All Performing Arts are four (4) minutes.
- There is a five (5) minute setup time limit for demonstrations. The 4-H'er may use assistance as necessary to set up within the five-minute limit.
- Live Animals including small animals such as fish, hamsters, and hermit crabs are not permitted at the Cloverleaf Project Competition.
- 4-H Cloverleaf Students are not allowed to bring to any district competitions or have in their possession at school during any 4-H event any item not allowed by the county school system.
- Videos, slides and computers may be used in the Computer, Photography and Communications projects only. 4-H'ers must provide their own slide projector, video projector, computer/ screen, extension cord, etc.
- Overhead projectors and portable music players may be used in any demonstration, however, the 4-H'er must furnish all equipment.
