



The granite marker in front of the Elbert County Extension Service Office/4-H Center was donated by ELBERTON GRANITE FINISHING COMPANY, INC. It was designed by Joe Fernandez of DESIGN MART. The large, wing-type sign is 6-ft., 6-in. high and 10-ft., 10-in. long. It has two wings and an upright center section on which a large cloverleaf 4-H symbol is skillfully sand carved.

The I.V. Hulme 4-H Center and the sign were dedicated November 20, 1983, after more than 1,000 voluntary donations were secured to transform the 10,000-sq.-ft. structure from a steel-frame-type building to a modern assembly and display facility to be used exclusively by Elbert County 4-H'ers. I.V. Hulme, for whom the center is named, was a prominent Elberton businessman who donated the original building and site.
