



# FRANKLIN COUNTY 4-H PLANT SALE



**Orders taken through March 7, 2012**

## **Blueberry bushes - 1 gallon - \$8**

Blueberries are relatively pest free once established. Average family needs 4-6 bushes. Must have 2 varieties for cross pollination. Need full sun. Plant them as close as 4-6 feet apart for hedge or screen or 10-12 feet apart for maximum fruit production. Early season starts ripening in mid-June. Mid-season usually ripens early July. Detail plant descriptions are available upon request.

## **Figs – Brown Turkey - 1 gallon - \$8**

Bronze, medium size fruit, excellent for preserving.

## **Blackberry Plants – 1 gallon - \$8**

**Ouachita:** Fruit are large in size, very good flavor, and an average sugar content of 10- 11%. Fruit ripen mid season over about five weeks with consistently high yields.

**Arapaho:** Fruit are medium in size, good flavor, and an average sugar content of 9-10%. Fruit ripen early over about a four week period with good yields.

**Navaho:** Fruit are medium in size, excellent flavor, and an average sugar content of 11-12%. Fruit ripen mid-season over a five to six week period with good yields. Fruit are also very firm making storage and handling potential exceptional.

## **Muscadine Vines- 1 gallon - \$8**

### **Self-fertile**

**Carlos:** Bronze small fruit, ripens medium/early, 16% sugar

**Nesbitt:** Black, self-fertile, very large fruit, high yields, ripens mid to late season. Plants very vigorous, disease resistant and cold hardy.

### **Female (must have one of the above interplanted to ensure pollination)**

**Summit:** Reddish Bronze large fruit. One of the best for home use, 20% sugar.

**Scarlett :** Red large fruit, excellent flavor, disease resistant, very vigorous, 18% sugar.

**Hunt:** Black medium size fruit. 16-17% sugar. Great all-purpose variety, cold resistant.

**Fry:** Bronze, fruit very large, excellent flavor, large clusters, high yields, ripens early to mid-season, plants fairly vigorous and disease resistant. For many years the standard for bronze fruit!

## **Raspberries - 1 gallon - \$8**

**Nova:** Fruit are medium in size, dark red, and ripen early. Plants have average growth height and are fairly disease resistant. Climate Zones 4-8.

**Heritage:** Fruit are large in size, dark red, and very sweet. Plants have upright vigorous growth habits adapts well in most well drained soils. Climate Zones 4-10.

## **FLOWERING SHRUBS AND TREES**

**Abelia “Rose Creek”** – 1 gallon. Evergreen. 2-3 feet tall, 3-4 feet wide, full sun to partial shade, fragrant white flowers. \$5

**“Mt. Airy” Fothergilla** – 1 gallon. 3-5 feet high and 3-5 ft tall. Deciduous shrub noted for its profuse spring flowering, excellent summer foliage, excellent fall color, Full sun to part shade. \$6

**Thuja “Green Giant”** – 1 gallon. Hardy fast growing (3-5 feet per year). Grows to 50 feet tall. Very good for privacy screening, drought tolerant, no significant pest or disease, deer and bagworm resistant. Space 5-6 feet apart for fast screen, otherwise 10-12 feet apart. \$6

**“Goldmound” Spirea** – 1 gallon. Mounding 2 feet x 3 feet deciduous, leaves start out with reddish hue, fades to yellow, large cluster of small pink flowers. \$5

**Viburnum X burkwoodii ‘Mohawk’** – 3 gallon. Deciduous, glossy dark green leaves turn orange-red in fall. 8 feet tall, 10 feet wide, fragrant flowers. Sun to light shade. \$15

**Viburnum ‘Snowflake’** - 3 gallon. Deciduous, bright mid-green leaves turn rusty red in fall. Flowers throughout season. Full sun to part shade. Up to 15 feet tall, 6 feet wide. \$15

**Viburnum tinus** “Spring Bouquet” – 1 gallon. Evergreen, 6 ft. tall, 6 ft. high, dense fragrant white to light pink flowers, prefers full sun. \$6

**Fern “Autumn”** – 1 gallon - In spring, autumn fern’s fronds unfurl a copper red, then turn to bronze, and finally become a shiny dark green. Great in the woodland garden, massing, as a specimen or ground cover. Will also work well in containers. Some types serve as hosts for butterfly larvae. Grows 1-3 feet tall. \$6

**Fern “Tassel”** – 1 gallon - Cold hardy, evergreen fern with shiny dark green fronds that are a more subdued, paler green on the reverse side. \$6

**Gardenia “FrostProof”** – 1 gallon – Cold hardy, disease, insect and deer resistant. Full sun to partial shade. Grows 3-5 feet tall, 4-5 feet wide. \$6

**Red Maple (acer rubrum)** – 3 gallon - a seed grown red maple, red to yellow fall color – \$20

**Red Leaf Japanese Maple** – 3 gallon - \$25

**Green Leaf Japanese Maple** – 3 gallon - \$25

**Crape Myrtles - \$15 – 3 gallon pot**

**Pink Velour** - fuchsia pink, grows 6-10 feet, patented variety, semi-dwarf

**Sioux** – light pink; 1996 Georgia Gold Medal Winner. 10-15 feet

**Tuscarora** – dark pink blooms, grows 15-25 feet

**Natchez** – white; grows 20-30 feet

**Evergreen Azaleas – 1 gallon - \$5**

**Hershey Red** – Medium grower, 4 feet tall and wide. Blooms March-May, medium sized red double flowers.

**Hilda Niblet** – unique large pink and white blooms marked with deeper rose. Low growing – 12 inches in height, 3-4 feet wide.

**Girard’s Rose** – Heavy bloomer, mid-season, single, dark pink color. Grows 4 feet tall and wide.

**Mildred** - 2-3 inch lavender flowers, fragrant, 3 foot spread; early mid-season.
