

BLACKBERRIES

Ouachita Blackberry. Thornless; large size berry; sweet; holds up well after harvest; vigorous vines.



Arapaho Blackberry (thornless) early season
Thorn less, ripens mid-late June for about 4 weeks. Fruit is firm with slightly smaller seeds than Navaho. Flavor is very good, and the plant requires no support. No rust has been seen on this variety.

Navaho Blackberry (thornless) late season
ripens early-mid July for about 5 weeks. Fruit is firm and yields over a longer season than Arapaho. Excellent flavor. High sugar content and fruit stays firm well after picking.



MUSCADINES

Carlos (Self Fertile)--pollinating
Bronze, small fruit size. Ripens medium/early, and tastes similar to Scuppernong. 16% sugar.



Nesbitt

Nesbitt is a large, black, self-fertile cultivar bred in North Carolina. Fruit ripens over a three-week period and is suitable for fresh marketing. It is one of the most cold-tolerant fresh market varieties available.

Summit (female, must have at least 1 self fertile variety muscadine planted near it to ensure pollination). Large reddish bronze fruit, ripens mid season. One of the best for home use. 20% sugar.



Scarlett (Female) Red; fruit are large in size, high yields, very good flavor, dry stem scar, ripen mid season. Plants are cold hardy, have good disease resistance, and are very vigorous. Sugar Content 17.5%-18.5%. Uses: Fresh Market, Pick Your Own, and Home.

Hunt Muscadine

Black; fruit are medium in size, good flavor, large clusters, dark juicy flesh, medium to high yields, wet stem scar, ripen early to mid season. Plants are very vigorous and have good cold resistance. Hunt is a great all purpose variety to plant. Sugar Content 16%-17%. Uses: Fresh Market, Home, Wine, Juice and Jelly.

Fry Muscadine

Fry is a very large, very sweet muscadine – excellent flavor. Large clusters. Ripens early to mid-season, plants fairly vigorous and disease resistant. For many years, the standard for bronze fruit.



Nova Raspberry

A virtually thornless raspberry that produces bright red berries. Harvest starts early in the season. A very nice flavour, slightly tart. Produces tasty raspberries perfect for jams, preserves or eat straight off the plant. Will bear fruit in the second year of growth.

Heritage Raspberry

Large, red, firm berries; ripens late season. This is an upright plant. Best everbearing raspberry on the market.

Brown Turkey Fig

Bronze fruit, medium size, excellent for preserving.
