

What are you talking about?



To help keep the lines of communication open, here are some terms that are used often when talking 4-H.

pre-club member – youth between the ages of six and nine years who are in the first through fourth grade

cloverleaf member – youth who are at least nine years of age and in the fifth or sixth grade

junior member – youth who are in the seventh or eighth grade

senior member – youth who are between the ages of thirteen and nineteen and in the ninth through twelfth grade

4-H Demonstration – is “showing how” while “telling how.” You can actually make or do something (step-by-step) and have a finished product to show at the end, or you can just “tell how” by talking and showing visuals like charts, graphs, drawings, models, photographs, or cut-outs.

County Project Achievement – or CPA is giving a demonstration on a subject of your choice while competing against others in your county who chose the same subject; this event is for Cloverleaf Members.

Cloverleaf District Project Achievement – or DPA is when all first place winners in your County Project Achievement event travel to another county in the district to compete against other first place winners; this event is for Cloverleaf Members.

Jr./Sr. District Project Achievement – or Jr./Sr. DPA is when students in seventh through twelfth grades* travel to one location and compete against other Jr./Sr. 4-H'ers who chose the same demonstration subject.

*seventh and eighth graders compete separately from ninth through twelfth graders.
