Tips on Being a Winner at CPA

APPEARANCE: Should be appropriate for the subject of the project.

VISUAL AIDS: Posters should be legible at a distance.
Remember pictures are better than words.
Posters will be judged on their contribution to the project.

DELIVERY: Speak in a normal distinct tone, not too fast, but loud enough to be heard in the back of the room.
Look at the audience, if notes are used, they should be on cards and in order. **Do not read speech.**

ORDERLY: Introduction - Body - Conclusion
Remember to introduce yourself- give your name, and school. Then start with your introduction.

ACCURACY: Use current resources. (At least 3)
Narrow the material down to two or three primary subjects and go into depth.

KNOWLEDGE: Become familiar with all phases of your subject.
Have more than one source of information.

TIME LIMIT: Complete your project within the 4 to 5 minute time limit.
You also have a 5 minute set up time.

All performing arts are a maximum of 4 min. including introduction
Between meal snacks is a 1hr lab (including set up, preparation & clean up)
Public speaking is 6 minutes with no visuals.
