A presentation using posters or other props (visual aides). **Showing steps of preparation is not required.**



**Three parts-** Your demonstration needs: a catchy **Introduction**, a **Body** with interesting details, and **Conclusion**.



**Note cards-** Make sure to write down your speech on note cards. Look at your audience more than your cards.



**Time limit-** Remember your time limit is 4 – 5 minutes.



**Visuals-** This is how your audience will see what you are talking about. Keep them large enough to see.



**Practice-** Find time to practice, practice and practice!! Practicing your speech will make it easier to present.

### EXCEPTIONS TO ILLUSTRATED TALKS

**\*\* Between Meal Snacks** – to plan snacks that contribute essential nutrients – must be no-cooking.

**\*\* Performing Arts** - General, Instrumental and Vocal (maximum 4 minutes)

**\*\* Creative Stitchery** – To learn to select and use basic sewing equipment for completing a simple garment or item.

**\*\* Public Speaking** – to present a 6 minute speech on any subject. (No visual aides or props)

\*\*\* See list of topics for details and special requirements\*\*\*

\*\*Some of the above exceptions to illustrated talks may not be appropriate for school demonstrations, due to the length of time. Before you choose one of the topics listed above, check with your teacher and 4-H Leader. You can choose one of these topics for competition, but you must follow all guidelines.

<b>*Between Meal Snacks</b> — Members will <i>plan and bring a partial daily menu including a dinner meal and a snack and prepare the no-cook (no-bake) snack food from this plan.</i> The no cook snack must be prepared in the one hour time allotted including setting up, preparation of the dish, display and clean up. Ingredients for recipe prepared must be measured on site during competition. Ingredients that will be peeled, chopped or cut, however, must be prepared at home and brought to the contest ready for use as knives are not allowed at cloverleaf competition. 4-H'ers should display the snack. 4-H'ers will provide all food and equipment needed; be dressed appropriately with closed toe shoes and <b>hair net</b> . 4-H'ers will be scored on management and food preparation techniques; serving prepared snack appropriately; knowledge of foods, nutrition and meal planning exhibited in discussion with judges.	<b>Housing Equipment &amp; Environment</b>
