Integrated Pest Management skills are vital tools that Master Gardeners can use in local projects and to assist clients with making pest management decisions. This training is designed to improve trouble shooting and problem solving in applying IPM to landscapes and gardens. Master Gardeners who earn advanced certification in *Integrated Pest Management* will be trained to assist homeowner clientele in the identification and treatment of pests in the landscape. [Advanced Master Gardener](#) classes are open to certified Master Gardeners who have completed the initial MG Training Program and 50 hour volunteer work requirement, have a currently active status, and local County Extension office written approval to attend. Master Gardeners need not be members of the Georgia Master Gardener Association to attend. This program is designed to satisfy the specialization requirement for Master Gardeners to attain a [Gold Star Level](#). Participants must attend all three modules to receive credits for a Gold Star.
