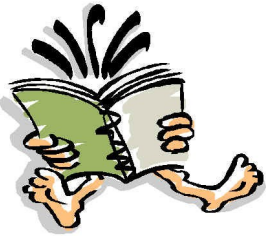
* You must help with at least 3 Cloverleaf Project Achievement workshops to be a Teen Leader at the area project achievement competition.

Main Project Sharing & Helping

Remember that we will have Main Project Sharing & Helping at EVERY $\Sigma \Delta X$ meeting!

February 14: Be ready to present a short "History of" speech at the meeting. You will share the history of something related to your project. Example: if your project is Arts & Crafts, you could talk about the history of ballet or the history of origami.

February 28: It's show and tell time! Bring in an object related to your project and 'show' us and 'tell' us about it. Example: if your project is Performing Arts: Other Instrumental, bring in your guitar & show us the different parts.

March 13: Lightening Talk! At this meeting, you will be given 1 minute to talk about a topic within your project! Your goal is to share as much information as possible. Get creative & fun!

March 27: We are asking you to present a short 2-3 minutes persuasive speech about why others should participate in your project. Why it is important? What have you learned? How can you apply this information?
