Bobby Smith, Morgan County Cooperative Extension- Agriculture and Natural Resources Agent, recently won the National Association of County Agricultural Agents (NACAA) 2011 Distinguished Service Award at the NACAA Annual Meeting and Professional Improvement Conference in Overland Park, Kansas.
