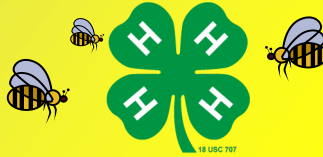

The University of Georgia's Entomology Department will determine the top three essays in Georgia and send the first ranked winner on to compete on the national level, competing against states across the nation

2012 Topic: “The Results of Honey Bee Pollination in my Community”

Honey bees pollinate a wide variety of plants. The food crops that benefit from honey bee pollination have been said to contribute one-third of the American diet. 4-H'ers are encouraged to investigate the plants in their communities that benefit from honey bee pollination and determine the results of that pollination in a essay of 750 to 1000 words.

Essays will be judged on :

- (a) scope of research - 40%;
- (b) accuracy - 30%;
- (c) creativity - 10%;
- (d) conciseness - 10%;
- (e) logical development of the topic - 10%.
