Greetings: A small amount of Asian soybean rust was FINALLY found on kudzu in Georgia late last week- 1 out of 68 leaves collected in a small kudzu patch in Decatur County south of Attapulgus. Though current weather favors some spread of the disease, I do not think it matters much at this point.

Canola-Profitable Wheat Alternative Dr. John M. Woodruff

The following message comes from Dr. John M. Woodruff and Robert Bruce Davis, PE.

Their question is as follows; we are inquiring as to whether you might have interest in a joint grower meeting to explore 2011 canola profit potential.

In 2008, AgStrong Inc., Bowersville, Georgia, built an identity preserve oilseed processing facility in Georgia for canola and sunflower. They are now offering high oleic acid canola production contracts to growers this fall, see attachment. For some producers, this could be an attractive alternative to wheat. At current commodity prices, this canola can be booked at about \$10/bu. The contract variety is Dow NEX845CL. It is a high oleic acid variety with Clearfield herbicide technology. NEX845CL is very similar to the UGA Flint canola in terms of agronomic traits and yield.

Robert Davis, PE with AgStrong, and I are offering production meetings to discuss canola production needs and contract profit opportunity. If you think that there might be local interest, we would like to offer a breakfast, lunch or dinner meeting in your area.
