## PEANUTS

FROM: John Beasley, Extension Peanut Agronomist

The weather forecast for South Georgia over the next few days and into the weekend call for 40-50% chance of rain Tuesday evening through Thursday followed by much cooler temperatures. In fact, the lows for the Tifton area for Friday through Sunday are in the mid to upper 30's to low 40's and highs only in the mid to upper 60's. Areas north of Tifton are forecast to reach near freezing on Saturday or Sunday morning. This temperature range, especially on the low side, will shut down the peanut maturation process.

Here are my recommendations:

1) DO NOT dig any fields the day before there is a risk of frost or possible freezing temperatures. There is still a lot of moisture in the peanut the day after digging. If the kernel is still closely attached to the inside of the hull (not turned loose), it is at greater risk of freeze damage, which results in a Seg 2 peanut. We've had enough Seg 2 damage from burrower bug, we don't need to add any more due to poor digging decisions.

2) With a 50-50 chance of rain in the middle of the week, any fields dug on Monday or Tuesday will not have time to dry down enough for combining if rain does fall by Thursday. Those fields may dry down just enough that near freezing temperatures over the weekend won't cause any damage. Fields dug on Tuesday and rained on Wednesday or Thursday might be more at risk for damage if frost or freezing temperatures occur Saturday morning.

3) If vines are in good shape, wait and dig after the risk of frost and/or freezing temperatures have passed. That might mean waiting to dig next week. If we do get as low as they are projecting, then you may as well recommend that all peanut fields be dug once the risk of frost or freeze has passed.

We caught a break this year in that the temperatures low enough to shut down the peanut maturation process came in November. Three of the past four years the low temps have come by the third week of October. It looks like this year we had an extra two weeks of warm temperatures that allowed late planted fields a little more time to mature.

## **\$2500 GRANT**

The following information will give you an opportunity that will award Terrell County a \$2500 grant. There is little to do other than enroll or allow Terrell County Extension to enroll you in the program. There is a significant amount of information about this Monsanto program. This newsletter highlights for you most of the program. The “America’s Farmers Grow Communities Project” is a program sponsored by the Monsanto Fund to support local farming communities.

### **MONSANTO**

Rural communities are important to farmers. They give farmers a place to call home, a place to meet with friends for breakfast, a place to raise families. Now, Georgia farmers in 25 counties have the opportunity to win \$2,500 awards for their favorite nonprofit organization. The awards are available through Monsanto Fund’s America’s Farmers Grow Communities SM program. The program’s first two pilots provided nearly 500 farmers in 10 states with \$2,500 awards to direct to their favorite nonprofit. That totals nearly \$1.2 million invested since the first pilot program began in January. The program has now expanded to more than 1,200 counties across 38 states.

The America’s Farmers Grow Communities program is intended to benefit non-profit community groups such as Ag youth organizations, schools and other civic groups important to America’s farmers. Farmers can apply online at [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com), or they can call 1.877.267.3332 to apply by phone. Farmers, age 21 and over, who are actively engaged in farming a minimum of 250 acres of corn, soybeans and/or cotton, or 40 acres of open field vegetables, or at least 10 acres of tomatoes, peppers and/or cucumbers grown in protected culture are eligible.

Farmers can enter now through Dec. 31, 2010. The program is open to all qualifying farmers, and no purchase is necessary in order to enter or win. One winner will be drawn from each of the participating counties, and Monsanto Fund will announce winning farmers and recipient organizations by February 2011.

### **America's Farmers Grow Communities Project Overview**

#### **Growing Rural America One Community at A Time**

The America’s Farmers Grow Communities Project is a program sponsored by the Monsanto Fund to support local farming communities. The program allows farmers to register to win \$2,500 for their favorite community charity. It only takes about two minutes to apply for those farmers residing in one of 1,204 eligible counties in 38 states.

For every farmer who applies, Monsanto will donate \$1 to their local United Way to help food banks, food pantries, Meals On Wheels and other charitable organizations dealing with hunger in their respective county.

### **What is the America's Farmers Grow Communities Project?**

The America's Farmers Grow Communities Project is a program, sponsored by the Monsanto Fund, to support farming communities by offering farmers the opportunity to register to win \$2,500 for their favorite community charity. Recipients could include FFA, 4-H, school or other civic organization – e.g., hospital, fire department or food pantry. It only takes about five minutes to apply, and the application period is August 31 – December 31, 2010. The program started with 179 awards in Missouri, Arkansas and Iowa. Due to its success, the program expanded to 298 counties in California, Kansas, Nebraska, North Carolina, Ohio, South Carolina and South Dakota, and is now expanding nationally to 38 states and 1,204 counties.

### **How does a farmer register?**

Eligible farmers can fill out an entry form at [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com) or by calling 1-877-267-3332 to receive a copy of the entry form and rules. Completed entries can be mailed to Eileen Jensen, 914 Spruce Street, St. Louis, MO 63102. One winner will be drawn for each eligible county from all eligible entrants received for that county. No purchase is necessary to enter or win.

### **Is this a new program?**

This program is similar to the pilot programs that were sponsored by Monsanto Company and the Monsanto Fund. The initial program began in January 2010 and made awards in Arkansas, Iowa and Missouri. After receiving a lot of positive feedback from farmers, Monsanto Fund expanded the program to include farmers in 298 counties in California, Kansas, Nebraska, North Carolina, Ohio, South Carolina and South Dakota. Thanks to increasingly positive feedback from growers, we are now launching the program in 38 states and 1,204 counties.

### **Why are you sponsoring this project?**

Rural communities are the heart of America. It's where we find the people who work hard to feed, fuel and clothe our country, and the world. We believe in rural America, and we want to support the communities where farmers, Monsanto Company's customers, live and work.

### **How are the winners chosen?**

Winners are randomly selected by a third party.

### **Why aren't the winners based on merit/need of their organization?**

We believe farmers who register will make a good decision on where the money is most needed to support their communities; and we wanted to make the process as simple and easy as possible.

### **When will the winners be announced?**

Winners will be selected in January 2011 and announced by February 2011.

### **Why did you choose only these counties?**

Every county is certainly worthy of receiving these community grants. These counties were selected based on crop parameters from the January 2010 USDA report. Entrants must reside in eligible counties where a minimum of 30,000 acres of corn and/ or soybeans and/or cotton and/or vegetables are planted each year.

**Does the donation have to be made in the county in which you live?**

Yes. We want all of the counties to benefit from the program so we ask that you choose an organization in your home county. If you live and farm in two different counties, please use your address from the county to which you want to make the donation.

**Can you split the donation between two organizations?**

No. We ask that you select one organization in your community.

**What is the criteria for organizations that can receive the grants?**

The recipient of the grant must meet the Internal Revenue Code definition of a charitable organization. If the winner resides in a city with more than 30,000 residents, then the organization must be an agriculture-related organization - 4-H, FFA, food pantry, etc. If the winner resides in a city of 30,000 or fewer, the organization must fit within one of two priority areas: 1. Community Enrichment – schools, hospitals, community centers, ballparks, fire departments, etc.; or 2. Youth in Agriculture – 4-H and FFA.

**Why can only farmers apply?**

Monsanto Company's only business is agriculture, so Monsanto Fund has a special interest in supporting farmers. The purpose of the project is for farmers to choose where they think the money is most needed in their communities.

**Are you doing this again next year?**

We hope to repeat and expand the program.

**Can a participant be eligible for the national rollout if he/she has participated in one of the pilot programs?**

Yes, participants from the two initial pilot programs are eligible for inclusion in the national rollout if selected.

**Plant \$2,500 in your community and watch it grow.**

Entrants must be 21 years or older and actively engaged in farming a minimum of 250 acres of corn, soybeans and/or cotton, or 40 acres of open field vegetables, or at least 10 acres of vegetables grown in protected culture.

Entrants must reside in eligible

counties in Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North

Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, Wisconsin or Wyoming where a minimum of 30,000 acres of corn and/or soybeans and/or cotton and/or vegetables are

planted each year. Farmers who were eligible for and/or participated in Pilots I and II of the program may also make an application for this round. Visit [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com) for a full list of eligible counties and organization eligibility.

## **America's Farmer Grow Communities Project Official Rules**

NO PURCHASE NECESSARY. A PURCHASE WILL NOT INCREASE YOUR CHANCE OF WINNING. THIS PROGRAM IS VOID WHERE PROHIBITED BY LAW.

**1. Program Entry Period:** Entries for this program must be received between 12:00:01 a.m. Central Time on August 31, 2010 and 11:59:59 p.m. Central Time on December 31, 2010 (the "Program Entry Period").

## **2. Eligibility:**

County Eligibility – This program is open to farmers who live or farm in the Eligible Counties listed in Section 14 of these Official Rules and on [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com). These are counties that meet either of the following criteria:

- a total of either (i) 30,000 acres of corn, soybeans and/or cotton, or (ii) 30,000 acres of vegetables (defined as one or more of the following: pepper; tomato; onion; broccoli; cucumber; melons; watermelons; spinach; squash; pumpkin; sweet corn; lettuce; peas; and garden beans), are planted per calendar year based on January 2010 USDA data; or
- the county was eligible to participate in prior Grow Communities programs.

Farmer Eligibility – Entrants must be 21 years or older and actively engaged in farming a minimum of 250 acres of corn, soybeans and/or cotton; or 40 acres of open field Vegetables (as defined above) ; or at least 10 acres of tomatoes, peppers, and/or cucumbers grown in protected culture (glasshouse, nethouse, plastic). Entrants are limited to one entry per qualified person (regardless of the form of entry). A farmer is "actively engaged in farming" if he or she performs the work, or hires and actively manages others who do so.

Eligible Charities – In order to receive a grant from Monsanto Fund under this program (a "Grant"), the charity selected by an entrant (a "Charity") must be a tax-exempt public charity, meaning that the Charity must be recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) or as a "unit of government" under Section 170(c)(1). Section 501(c)(3) is a section of the Internal Revenue Code that establishes criteria for tax-exempt charitable organizations. Section 170(c)(1) refers to agencies that conduct business to benefit the public at large, such as public schools, libraries and municipalities. Any Charity that discriminates based on race, creed, ethnicity, religion, sex, age or national origin is not eligible to receive a Grant. Section 5 of these Official Rules includes other requirements regarding Grants.

*Not Eligible to Participate* – The following are not eligible to participate in this program: (i) officers, directors, and employees of Monsanto Fund (the “Sponsor”), or of any of its representatives or advertising/promotion agencies; (ii) officers, directors, and employees of Monsanto Company, or of any of its subsidiaries or affiliates; (iii) officers, directors and employees of any dealers, sales representatives or advertising/promotion agencies of Monsanto Company or of any of its subsidiaries or affiliates; and (iv) immediate family members of any of the officers, directors or employees listed in (i), (ii), or (iii) above.

**3. How to Enter:** No purchase necessary to enter or win. There are two ways to enter this program, as described below. Entries may only be made according to the procedures described in these Official Rules.

A. To enter the program online, visit [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com) and submit an entry during the Program Entry Period. All entrants are required to complete all required registration information (including, without limitation, your name, address and other contact information). All entries must be completed within the Program Entry Period to be eligible to win. All submissions become the property of the Sponsor and will not be acknowledged or returned.

B. To enter the program by mail, please call 1-877-267-3332 or go to [www.growcommunities.com](http://www.growcommunities.com) to print out the official rules and nomination form. Once completed, please mail to Eileen Jenson, 914 Spruce St., St. Louis, MO 63102 during the Program Entry Period. Entries must be received by the Sponsor within the Program Entry Period. Entries received after the end of the Program Entry Period will not be accepted. Limit one entry per envelope. All submissions become the property of the Sponsor and will not be acknowledged or returned.

C. Entries that do not comply with these Official Rules will be disqualified. The Sponsor reserves the right in its sole discretion to disqualify any entry at any time which, in its opinion, is offensive, contains unsuitable material, threatens the safety or wellbeing of any entrant, or if it is determined that the entrant has not complied with these Official Rules. Limit one entry per person, regardless of method of entry. Entries in excess of this limit are void. To be valid, each entry must provide all information requested.

**4. Awards and Grants:** A winner will be selected for each eligible county for which at least one eligible entry is received from a farmer who resides or farms in such county, and the Sponsor will award each winner the right (an “Award”) to select a Charity that will receive a \$2,500 Grant. The Grant must be used by the Charity to improve local communities and organizations in the county in which the winner resides or farms and that the farmer has designated on the entry application. If the Sponsor does not receive an entry for any eligible county, the Sponsor will not make an Award, or a Grant under this program, with respect to that county. Odds of winning depend on the total number of eligible entries received for each county. The Sponsor reserves the right to cancel the program at any time. All details about the Awards and Grants not specified in these Official Rules will be determined by the Sponsor at its sole discretion. No entrant may win more than one Award and no entrant may enter in more than one eligible county.

The Awards and Grants are not transferable. No substitution of an Award or Grant, or any portion thereof, is allowed, except at the sole discretion of the Sponsor. An Award has no retail value, and there is no income to be reported to the winner for tax purposes. The winner will not be able to obtain an income tax deduction as a result of the Grant made by the Sponsor to the Charity.

**5. Instant Donation:** For every farmer who enrolls in the program, the Monsanto Fund will donate \$1 to United Way in the county for which the farmer has enrolled.

**6. Use of a Grant:** A Charity that is named by a winner and receives a Grant must provide the Sponsor with written notice of how the Charity proposes to use the Grant, and such proposed project must be within the county where the winner resides.

If the winner resides in a city with a population of over 30,000, the Grant must go to an agriculture related organization – 4-H, FFA, food pantry, etc. For winners in cities of 30,000 or fewer, the proposed project for which the Charity desires to use the Grant must fit within one of two priority areas: (i) Community Enrichment – hospitals, community centers, schools, ballparks, fire departments, etc.; or (ii) Youth in Agriculture – 4-H and FFA.

Grants may not be used for any of the following: (a) individual aid or personal support; (b) underwriting deficits; (c) fraternal, labor or veterans' organizations, unless the project benefits the general public; (d) benefits, dinners or advertisements; (e) religious, politically partisan, or similar groups; (f) endowments; (g) activities that directly support marketing programs; or (h) projects in which Monsanto Fund or Monsanto Company has a financial interest, or from which either one could derive a financial benefit. Determinations of whether the proposed use of funds meets the criteria described herein shall be made in the Sponsor's sole discretion.

**7. Winner Selection:** On or about January 3, 2011, a third party will randomly select one (1) winner for each eligible county from all eligible entries received for such county during the Program Entry Period. Winners will be notified by phone and/or e-mail by February 2011. In the event that more than one prospective winner is inadvertently named for any Award, a drawing will be held among all such potential winners to select one.

**8. Conditions:** By participating in this program, each entrant agrees as follows: (a) to be bound by these Official Rules which are final and binding in all respects, and to comply with all decisions of the Sponsor with regard to the Official Rules, their interpretation or application; (b) that he or she meets all the eligibility requirements under these Official Rules; (c) to comply with all federal, state and local laws and regulations; and (d) that Missouri law, without regard to its conflict of laws principles, shall apply exclusively to the program and Official Rules and that any dispute with respect to the program and/or these Official Rules shall be resolved in either the federal or state courts located in the State of Missouri, County of St. Louis.

**9. Data Privacy:** Information that entrants provide to the Sponsor will be used to communicate with participant(s) in relation to this program. Entrants may choose not to receive such communications at any time.

**10. General:** The Sponsor is not responsible for any typographical or other errors in the printing or offering of this program, or in the description of any Award or in any other materials produced in connection with the program. Sponsor is not responsible for lost, garbled, misrouted, damaged, distorted, late, stolen or misdirected submissions. The Sponsor reserves the right at its sole discretion to cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the program. In particular, the Sponsor reserves the right to cancel or modify the program if fraud, misconduct or technical failures would destroy the integrity of the program; or, if a computer virus, bug or other technical problem corrupts the administration, security or proper administration of the program as determined by the Sponsor in its sole discretion. Uses of automated devices are not valid for submission and will subject the user to immediate disqualification.

The Sponsor may disqualify any person based upon fraud, dishonesty, and violation of rules or other misconduct. This program is subject to all applicable federal, and/or state rules and regulations and is void where prohibited by law. In the event of termination of the program, a notice will be posted online. The Sponsor reserves the right to prohibit the participation of an individual if fraud or tampering is suspected or if the individual fails to comply with any requirement of participation as stated herein or with any provision in these Rules. Entrants must comply with all rules as published.

**11.
