

# International Agriculture Scholarship

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The International Agriculture Certificate Program offers a limited number of \$500 - \$750 scholarships to International Agriculture Certificate students. To apply, please submit:

- This application form
- A finalized budget for you internship (including travel, lodging, meals, insurance, etc.)
- Internship Description (2 pages):
  - Provide a brief internship description. Describe your interest in this particular internship and the learning outcomes you hope to achieve.
  - Given the short duration of your internship and that you will be conducting it in a different culture and language, it is unlikely that you will be asked to take on significant responsibilities by your hosts. In fact, you may spend much of your time shadowing/observing and learning how things are done where you are placed. This can be difficult for students who expect to make high-level contributions during their program. However, the primary purpose of your internship is cultural and language immersion. How will you manage your expectations?
- Essay (max 3 pages) detailing how you will ensure your health & personal safety while abroad.
  - Pre-departure (i.e. banking & communication plans, appointment with UGA travel clinic, necessary immunizations, CISI health insurance, STEP enrollment, etc.)
  - Plans to ensure your access to medicines and other health supplies for the duration of your trip (i.e. prescription drugs, over the counter meds, first aid provisions).
  - Description of your plan in the event of an emergency (consider potential financial, political, and medical situations).
  - Outline your commitment to keeping your UGA travel registry updated when you leave internship site and why this is important.
  - Provide a brief summary of crime and safety information for the country and city you will be visiting. Note that neighborhood-specific information is often available. Explain how this information will influence your actions.
  - Compare the protection of equal rights in your host country with those in the US with respect to gender, race or ethnicity, religion, and sexual orientation.
  - Outline of cultural expectations of visitors in your study abroad country.

Please allow two months for proposal evaluation. Awards are subject to the availability of funds.
